The red "P" plate driver had been driving at excessive speed and smashed into a power pole. The car was totally destroyed and the emergency services had to cut the occupants out of the car.

Guess what the crash victims were doing as they were being cut out of the car at great inconvenience to their rescuers? They were taking "selfies" of themselves on their mobile phone!

The self seems to be the new god of the current times. Obsession with self has stopped a lot of people from participating in the experiences of life and enjoying the value of the experience. They are more focussed upon getting the photo than on the experience. The self in the photo is what matters.

Sadly, self starts to get problematic when it is such a big consideration. So much focus gets put on things like self-esteem, self-righteousness, self-consciousness,

self-appreciation, self-love, self-value, self-centredness.

I am reminded of the Greek myth where the young Narcissus fell in love with his own image reflected in a pool of water. He loved his image so much that he stayed staring at himself in the pool till he died. He lost his will to live. He just wanted to look at himself.

Narcissism is the pursuit of gratification from vanity or egotistic admiration of one's own attributes. It is when you are all about yourself. It is considered a psychological problem. Sadly, too many people have it.

Jesus taught that life is not about the self. Consumed with self, we lose life. Real life, according to Jesus, is knowing God and in so doing we can be free of the bondages of self.

The greatest burden we have to carry in life is self; the most difficult thing we have to manage is self. When self reigns supreme, our world view narrows and for many people, it narrows down to the view finder on a mobile phone.

My self gives me more trouble than any other person, and guess what? I don't even know how to take a "selfie".

Watch yourself and watch others as they over compensate for themselves with valuing the photo over the experience. The photo is only a reflection.


